A Word from the Pastor...

Good morning (or whatever it is when you read this), I am coming to you from my home, working for you, good people of Milford and its surrounding area. As we approach the steamy days of summer this month and into next, I can't help but experience a little of the heat of summer (even in this early part of the day.) The humidity is enveloping and invading my living room, the remains of the day that just passed. It is a kind of strength-sapping weather. But it is summer, after all, and we must expect it.

The reading in the Upper Room devotional magazine for today was from the Psalms, specifically #121, which is, according to its superscription, or the reason for its writing, "A Song of Ascents." That means it was probably written for the comfort of pilgrims making their way to the temple in Jerusalem, climbing the hills surrounding it after perhaps a long journey from a far-flung area of the region. It would be a trip only undertaken at most a few times in the year when all of Israel was required to be there or maybe the pilgrim had an opportunity in a time of rest to travel. The first question the psalmist asks is, "I lift up my eyes to the hills -

from where will my help come?" (Verse 1). I can picture the pilgrim, weary from their journey and seeing the last climb they had to make before them, taking a deep breath and steeling themselves for that last push to the temple mount. But the psalmist answers the question in the best way he knows, "My help comes from the Lord, who made heaven and earth." (Verse 2) There is confidence in the Creator of everything and in his ability to connect with the pilgrim and to cover them with the protection of an everpresent God. The verse that really got my attention was the 6th, "The sun shall not strike you by day, nor the moon by night." There is not a time in your day when the Lord is not present with you and ready to come to your aid if needed. And that is such a comfort to me, and should be to you as well. "God is good all the time," the saying goes, "and all the time God is good." Whether you are ascending that last great obstacle to Jerusalem, your place of solace, or are in the midst of some sort of trial on your way to that comfort. God is there.

I look forward to the summer worship in the Fellowship Hall for us, having the advantage of the air conditioner to battle its heat, and at least one Sunday in the sun in our newly-refurbished outdoor chapel to dedicate the facilities made possible by Mark Butters' Eagle Scout project and the team he assembled to get it done, including his father Malcolm. We also celebrate this month the time when we as a nation declared our independence from England and began that centurieslong enjoyment of selfgovernment. So, if you are not away this month, I invite you to join us for our 10:00 AM worship hour. Keep your eyes open for details as the month progresses.

Each year, United Women in Faith members prepare for faithful living and action by engaging in transformative educational experiences at Mission u events.


